2 The final qualifying examination for an ADI is the Test of Ability to Instruct (Part 3).

- (a) Describe the objectives of this test. (2 marks)

- (b) What are the two parts of this test? (2 marks)

- (c) Give six examples of the exercises that can be chosen in the first part. (6 marks)

- (d) Give two further examples of different exercises that can be chosen in the second part. (2 marks)

- (e) Describe what the examiner is looking for when assessing your performance. (8 marks)

3 Driving licences have conditions attached to them.

- (a) State three types of acceptable licence to enable temporary visitors from abroad to drive in the UK. (3 marks)

- (b) Under most circumstances, a full driving licence acts as a provisional for other groups.

Give four exceptions. (4 marks)

- (c) What are the conditions when applying for an LGV driver's licence? (6 marks)

- (d) Which full Category B driving licences must be renewed at regular intervals? (2 marks)

4 Insurance is required for vehicles to be used on the road.

- (a) What are the three main factors to be covered by this insurance? (3 marks)

- (b) To comply with the Road Traffic Legislation there must be a minimum cover.

What should this cover extend to? (3 marks)

- (c) What are the four types of cover available? (4 marks)

- (d) Describe each type of cover? (10 marks)

5 On a Practical Driving Test provisions can be made for some categories of candidates.

- (a) What are the provisions for non-English speaking candidates? (3 marks)

- (b) What are the provisions for deaf and mute candidates? (2 marks)

- (c) What factors does an examiner take into account when assessing a disabled candidate's competency? (3 marks)

- (d) What provisions are there for the test to be conducted in a language other than English? (2 marks)

6 Lights and reflectors on vehicles must comply with regulations.

- (a) State the maximum allowed wattage of headlights. (1 mark)

- (b) State the maximum allowed wattage of sidelights. (1 mark)

- (c) Describe the requirements for rear number plate illumination. (1 mark)

- (d) State three of the requirements relating to reversing lights. (3 marks)

- (e) What are the 'flash' frequencies for direction indicators? (1 mark)

- (f) Outline three rules which apply to the fitting of lights. (3 marks)

7 A vehicle must display an excise licence and a registration mark.

- (a) What particulars are shown on the excise licence? (8 marks)

- (b) Give two offences relating to a vehicle registration mark. (2 marks)
