- What considerations should be made by the driver before deciding to carry out this manoeuvre? (7 marks)
 - Describe, with the aid of a diagram, the procedures involved in reversing around a left hand corner. (8 marks)
- 4 Discuss the social and economic consequences of road accidents. (15 marks)
- 5 Wet weather conditions can lead to a variety of different driving hazards.
- What are the relevant vehicle checks on your vehicle before your journey? (4 marks)
 - What can you do to improve your visibility? (2 marks)
 - Explain the causes and effects of aquaplaning. (5 marks)
 - After a long dry spell there is a short, sharp shower of rain. Why is the road more slippery? (2 marks)
 - Discuss the procedure a driver should take when dealing with flooded roads. (7 marks)
