Answer all questions

- 1 The sense organs are very important in driving.
Discuss how the sense organs are used in driving and give examples to reinforce your answer. (15 marks)
- 2 Whilst teaching in a motor vehicle, the instructor must maintain the safety of the learning environment.
Apart from using dual controls, describe other methods that an instructor uses to maintain this safe environment. (10 marks)
- 3 An instructor should adopt a good questioning technique throughout a pupil's course of driving lessons.
- What are the benefits of this? (2 marks)
 - What is the difference between 'open' and 'closed' questions? Discuss the advantages and give examples of both. (4 marks)
 - What are the key elements involved in the successful application of questions and answers? (9 marks)
 - Explain the value of asking pupils questions on the Highway Code throughout their course of driving lessons. (5 marks)
- 4 Instructors need to motivate pupils in order to learn to drive.
Discuss these motivational factors in learning to drive and describe how you would motivate pupils. (15 marks)

- 5 Learning to drive is a very visual skill. Visual aids contribute to visual input during learning.
- Why should an instructor use visual aids? (3 marks)
 - Give **two** examples of good visual aids for use in-car and discuss their characteristics. (5 marks)
 - Draw and label one or more diagrams that you would use as in-car visual aids during a practical driving lesson to introduce a learner to reverse parallel parking. (7 marks)
- 6 Instructors should keep records of pupils' progress.
What are the benefits, both to pupils and to their instructors, of keeping records of their progress throughout a driver-training course? (10 marks)
- 7 When delivering a theory lesson to a group of 16- and 17-year old students at a local school, it is important that the instructor adopts the right manner.
- What are the main considerations that the instructor should be aware of in delivery? (10 marks)
 - How can an instructor ensure student involvement in the lesson? (5 marks)
