Answer all questions

- 1** An instructor should help a pupil to remember the information that is being taught.
Discuss and give examples of how an instructor can help the pupil remember the information easily. *(10 marks)*
- 2** When pupils are learning they can be influenced by a variety of factors. Explain briefly how each of the following is likely to affect the performance of a pupil who is learning to drive.
- (a) Physical discomfort *(4 marks)*
 - (b) Advancing age *(4 marks)*
 - (c) Alcohol and drugs *(4 marks)*
 - (d) Prescribed drugs and medicines *(4 marks)*
 - (e) Anxiety *(4 marks)*
 - (f) Dyslexia *(2 marks)*
 - (g) Hearing impairment *(3 marks)*
- 3** Instruction given whilst teaching in a vehicle can be teacher-centred or learner-centred.
Discuss these two approaches and show the difference between them. *(10 marks)*
- 4** An instructor is presenting a driving theory lesson.
How should the instructor's behaviour reflect a professional approach to the lesson? *(10 marks)*

- 5** The practical Driving Test has assessment criteria which candidates have to satisfy.
- (a) What are these criteria? *(5 marks)*
 - (b) Give ten test requirements which test candidates should be able to do. *(10 marks)*
 - (c) How should Driving Examiners conduct themselves during a driving test? *(5 marks)*
- 6** Learning is best achieved by being taught in short progressive steps.
Describe the steps and give examples of how you would use these steps in teaching a pupil to drive. *(10 marks)*
- 7** A driving instructor can conduct a driving lesson with more than one pupil in the car.
- (a) Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of teaching two pupils at the same time in the same car. *(6 marks)*
 - (b) Discuss the benefits or otherwise of teaching three pupils in the same car. *(4 marks)*
 - (c) Identify the benefits or difficulties of conducting a one- or two-hour driving lesson. *(5 marks)*
